Studying BSc (Hons) Business Accounting offers you an accessible route into an accountancy-based degree programme whilst offering professional exemptions on graduation. This programme gives you the opportunity to gain both a solid grounding in accountancy as well as understanding other business functions in preparation for a career using key financial and business skills.

Our four year course begins with a Foundation Year, the first year is designed to help boost your knowledge and skills so that you are up to speed and ready to meet the challenges of the main degree (Year 1 – Year 3).

If you choose to study our three year course, you will begin with six compulsory modules in the first year. These modules are designed to give a solid grounding in the subject and bring all students to a standard level of competence to pursue further study in accountancy.

In the second year you will study three modules designed to enhance your capabilities in areas of Financial Accounting and Management Accounting as well as in Financial Project Management. You will then study Personal Financial Behaviour, which will develop your understanding of personal financial products and behaviour, as well as what influences it.

In the final year you will study four compulsory modules designed to advance skills and knowledge appropriate to graduate level. You will then have a choice of two modules, Work Internship or Business Start Up. As you progress through this course, you will be required to devote more time to ethics, governance and controversial accounting principles and will study accounting rules and apply accounting skills. When you reach your final year of study you will find more emphasis on discussion, critical evaluation, reflection and anticipation of likely future developments, preparing you for a future career in accounting and business.

Career progression

There are many career and further study options open to graduates of this programme in the field of accounting, finance and business including; project management, business analysis, taxation, back office finance positions in the City and corporate finance. This programme currently benefits from some exemptions from various accounting bodies which may help your decision for future study or work.
